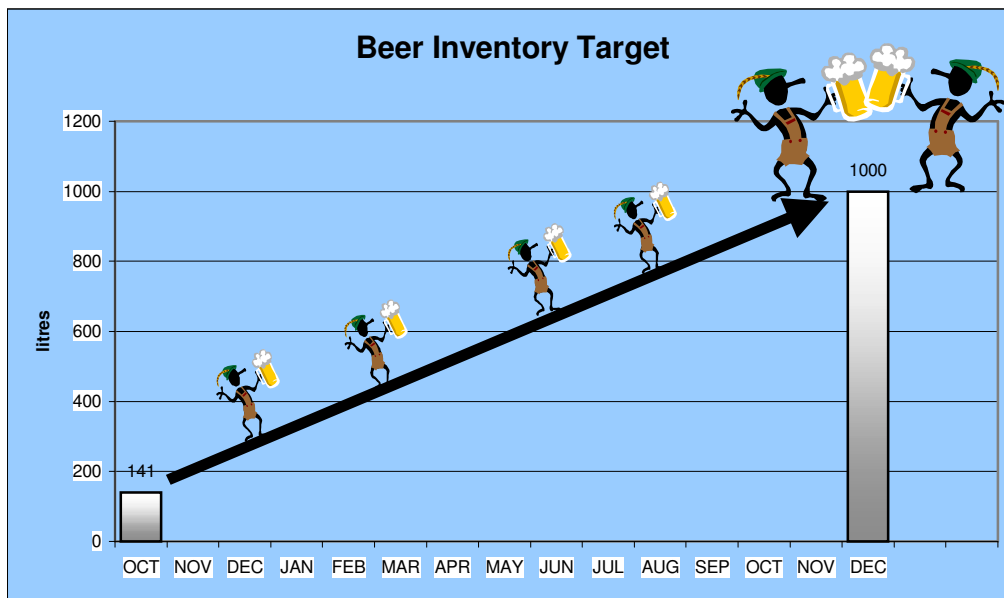


Figure 1: Where we are and where we need to be – get to it team!

Historically, beer-brewing output was at subsistence levels, that is, the levels required to get through one or two large BBQ's per month and maintain a merry outlook on world events.

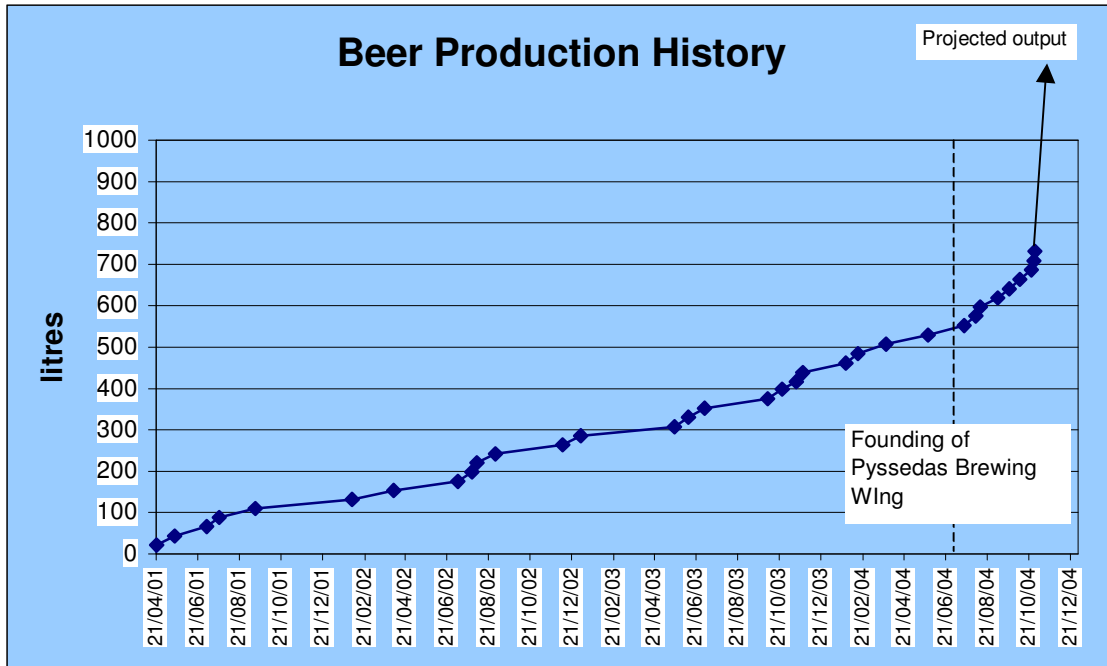


Figure 2: A line with dots on it, as well as a projection based on weighted variable forecasting theory

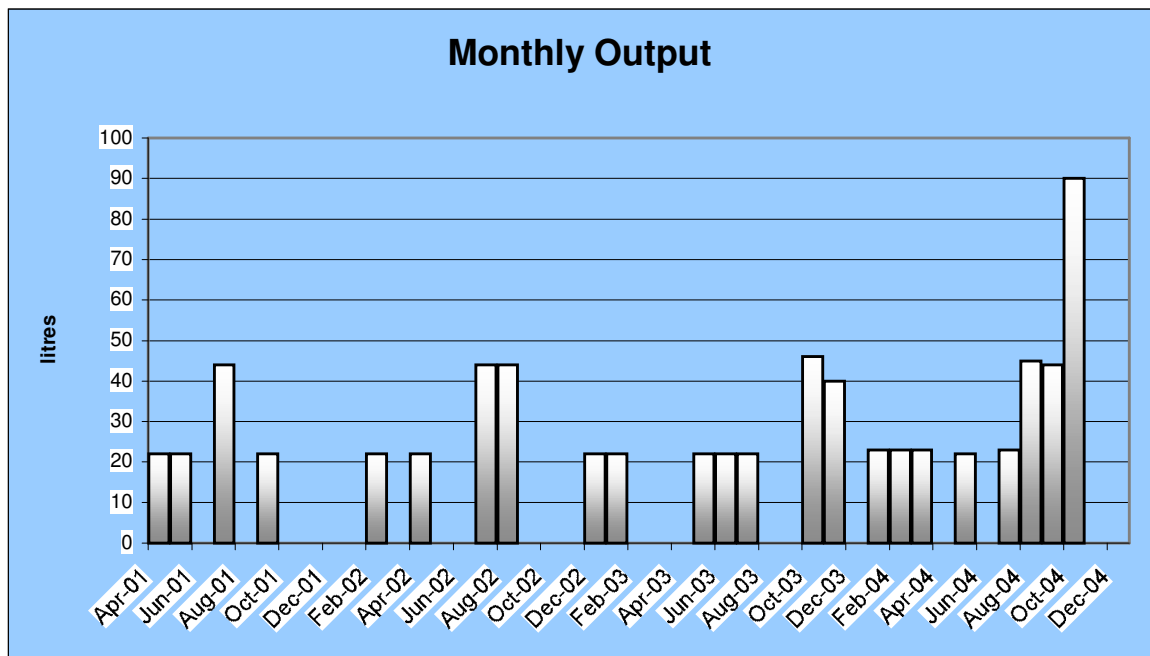


Figure 3:..This one's important!



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## Consumption Summary
